Description

 α -Phosphotrehalase 13A (*Ec*Tre13A), assigned the E.C. number 3.2.1.93, is a derivative of *Escherichia coli*. It is an α -phosphotrehalase. The recombinant *Ec*Tre13A, purified from *Escherichia coli*, is a single-domain Glycoside Hydrolase family 13 (GH13) enzyme (see more details at <u>www.cazy.org</u>). The protein is supplied in a solution containing 35 mM NaHepes buffer (pH 7.5), 750 mM NaCl, 200 mM Imidazole, 3.5 mM CaCl₂, and 25% (v/v) glycerol, at a concentration of 1 mg/mL. Electrophoretic Purity




Figure 1. SDS-PAGE analysis of *Ec*Tre13A (GH13) was conducted in (Lane 1), employing a 14% polyacrylamide gel. The enzyme exhibits a band corresponding to a molecular weight of approximately 65,78 kDa. Lane M contains a Protein Marker for reference.

The molecular integrity and purity of *Ec*Tre13A (GH13) were evaluated using sodium dodecyl sulfate-polyacrylamide gel electrophoresis (SDS-PAGE), followed by BlueSafe staining (MB15201) (Figure 1).

Storage temperature

The protein should be stored at -30°C to -15°C in a constant temperature freezer. The protein will remain stable till the expiry date if stored as specified.

Substrate specificity

*Ec*Tre13A (GH13) hydrolyses p-nitrophenyl- α -D-glucopyranoside (PNG), but it does not recognize trehalose, sucrose, maltose, isomaltose, or maltodextrins.

Temperature and pH optima

The pH optimum for enzymatic activity is 7.5 while temperature optimum is 25 °C.

The substrate specificity and kinetic properties of *Ec*Tre13A (GH13) are detailed in the referenced publication provided below. To perform enzyme assays and determine specific activity values, adhere to the methodology outlined in the cited paper(s).
