### **SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES**

#### 4.1 **Description of first aid measures:**

Request medical assistance immediately, showing the SDS of this product.

### By inhalation:

Remove the person affected from the area of exposure, provide with fresh air and keep at rest. In serious cases such as cardiorespiratory failure, artificial resuscitation techniques will be necessary (mouth to mouth resuscitation, cardiac massage, oxygen supply, etc.) requiring immediate medical assistance.

Remove contaminated clothing and footwear, rinse skin or shower the person affected if appropriate with plenty of cold water and neutral soap. In serious cases see a doctor. ### **SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES**

#### 4.1 Description of first aid measures:
