Description

SYNJ2BP PDZ Domain from *Homo sapiens* is a recombinant protein purified from *Escherichia coli*. The protein is provided in 35 mM NaHepes buffer, pH 7.5, 750 mM NaCl, 200 mM imidazol, 3.5 mM CaCl₂ and 25% (v/v) glycerol, at a 0.5 mg/mL concentration. Electrophoretic Purity

SYNJ2BP PDZ Domain purity was evaluated using sodium dodecyl sulfate-polyacrylamide gel electrophoresis (SDS-PAGE), followed by BlueSafe staining (MB15201) (Figure 1).



Figure 1. SDS-PAGE analysis of SYNJ2BP PDZ Domain was conducted in (Lane 1), employing a 14% polyacrylamide gel. The enzyme exhibits a band corresponding to a molecular weight of approximately 13.69 kDa. Lane M contains a Protein Marker for reference.

Storage temperature

The protein should be stored at -30°C to -15°C in a constant temperature freezer. The protein will remain stable till the expiry date if stored as specified.
